

Willard Community Center strives to nurture children and strengthen families. Preschool

The Center is dedicated to providing three- to fiveyear-olds with the opportunity to learn vital social skills, encourage intellectual growth and gain small and large motor skill development to prepare for kindergarten.

Before and After School Program

Willard provides staffing for the Community Learning Centers at Roper and Lakeview Schools. In addition to the assistance students receive at school, Willard also provides an on-site before and after school program and transports junior high students to and from Park Middle School. Our program offers a supervised environment where children can work on homework, receive extra help, build friendships and participate in a variety of activities.

Teen Program

Willard is the place for youth to gather year round. During the school year, our staff provides support and assists in improving their academic performance. Volunteer experiences introduce them to civic responsibility while building lasting friendships in the community.

Professional, Licensed Child Care


Willard provides much needed child care to working parents at a fraction of the typical cost.


HISTORY
